Our seasoned Campus Director oversees a team of Resident Advisors (RA). There is one RA for every 10 students. All residential staff have undergone background checks and are trained in CPR, First Aid, and student conflict and resolution management, creating a safe environment in which students can grow. Students will be either with staff members, in groups, or within a designated zone in which they can explore independently.

Code of Conduct

Summer Springboard expects students to act in a way that is respectful to the local community, promotes the educational goals of the program, and ensures the safety of all students. In order to achieve this, we have created a Code of Conduct that all students and parents are required to sign and follow. We have a zero tolerance policy towards drugs and alcohol. Violations of the Code of Conduct will trigger disciplinary action which could include expulsion from the Summer Springboard program.

Off-Campus Safety

For program excursions, we only use safe and comfortable vehicles driven by experienced, licensed drivers. Communication procedures, safety protocols and emergency preparedness plans are in place to ensure our program supervisors can handle every type of situation quickly and effectively. To ensure proper supervision, our student to staff ratio is at least 10-to-1. During free time, students are restricted to predetermined areas near campus. Our 24 hour hotline ensures that parents are always able to get in contact with staff in case of an emergency.

Student Accountability

At the start of the program the Campus Director will address students and talk through all safety issues and set student expectations. Any deliberate attempt to break the rules indicates a student's inability or unwillingness to do their part to ensure the group's safety and therefore the student must leave the program. Students are expected to check in with their Residential Advisor and may not leave their residence hall after curfew.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Are Flights Included?

The cost of flights are not included in the program tuition, in order to give you maximum flexibility in purchasing flights that work for your family. Once enrolled, you can book on your own using discount websites, utilizing frequent flyer miles that you may have accrued, or your own preferred travel agent should you have one.

How many students share a room?

Each room will house two to four students, depending on the housing location. You will have your own bed. Your room will include fresh linens and towels (but extra blankets and towels are recommended). The bathroom is shared.

How can my parents contact me while I am attending the program?

Students are permitted to bring a mobile phone to keep in touch with parents, but it must be turned off during program activities. Your parents or guardians will have the telephone number to the program's site office, where they can leave you messages. Additionally, parents and guardians may email the office should they need to relay information to you.

Are there any additional costs?

As a residential student everything is included in your program once you arrive on campus. You may add on an airport pick up or airport drop off for an additional fee. As a commuter student all is included except for meals and housing. If you wish to eat on campus during lunch time you may purchase a meal add-on for a nominal fee.

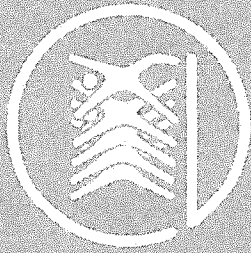

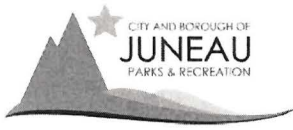

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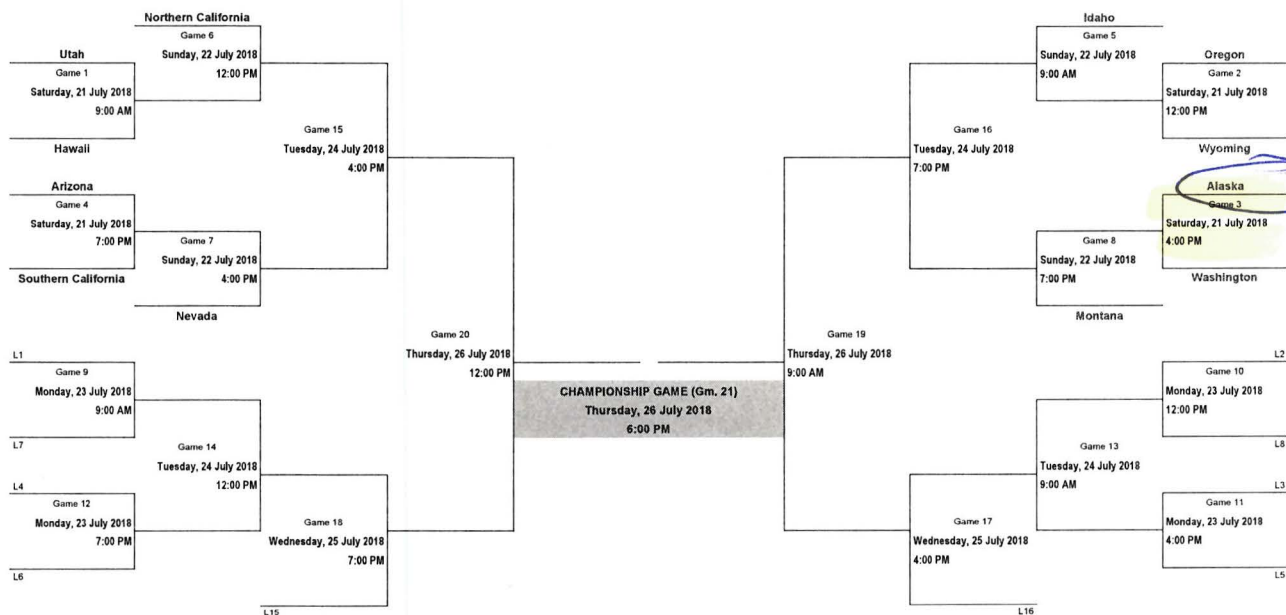
