F. STAFF REPORTS

Emergency Programs –Ryan OShaughnessy reported that EP has had a grant heavy month with the new EMPG grant that partially funds staff positions, the Emergency Operations Plan update grant, and the Public Assistance Grant program for a long list of infrastructure repairs from the 2024 and 2025 GLOF. He noted that some sites are getting damaged repeatedly such as trails and pedestrian bridges. He said that EP is restructuring and will soon be recruiting for a Preparedness Coordinator who will address avalanche forecasting among other responsibilities.

CCFR – Theresa Ross reported the Fire Chief is retiring and the deputy is moving. There are many staff vacancies and recruitment efforts continue.

Media – Justin Shoman reported on the State Emergency Communications meeting last month, and discussion of the weather services initiative to reduce over-alerting. He also noted the introduction of IPAWS into the system.

Red Cross – Britta Tonneson reported that De Hennos is the new preparedness specialist for the RC and she will be here for a year. She noted RC efforts with the blowdown in Elfin Cove and ongoing efforts in Klukwan with smoke alarm installation. Loren Jones responded to some single family fires in town. RC is prioritizing health fairs, and looking for more opportunities to get into community events to promote the RC.

National Weather Service – Nicole Ferrin reported on quieter weather patterns after weeks of high wind events. She noted that during the shutdown NWS is on operations-only status and not doing any outreach.

Alaska Native Tribal - Alisha Sell reported that CCTHIA is focused on grants right now, no travel or extra-curriculars with the shutdown.

DOT - Ken Murphy offered a reminder about fall safety checks with smoke alarms.

G. AGENDA TOPICS.

Juneau Red Cross Presentation by Britta Tonneson. Britta Tonneson provided an overview of the Red Cross organizational structure and disaster response, with a focus on Disaster Action Teams. The Red Cross receives no federal money and has over 15,000 volunteers nationwide. She noted that the primary need in Juneau is for more disaster action volunteers. See attached presentation.
