F. STAFF REPORTS

Emergency Programs –Teri Rehfeldt reported that Fairweather Science, in partnership with Tidal Basin, has been awarded the contract for the Emergency Operations Plan Update, with an aggressive timeline of completion within a year. Emergency Programs is busy chasing down grant funds and preparing for the upcoming flood season. Sarah McDonald is coordinating Corps of Engineers meetings and conducting training on Crisis Track software. John Bressette is wrapping up avalanche monitoring, and Juneau should be in the clear in a couple more weeks. EP is pushing attendance at the CERT class in late April/early May, and at the ICS 300 class May 20-22.

JPD - Jermey Weske reported that the Command Vehicle is still down, and JPD is looking for 38 feet of covered storage.

CCFR – Theresa Ross noted CCFR's new Fire Chief Tom Hatley, hope to have him attend the LEPC next month. CCFR is bringing in six battalion chief positions.

Bartlett Regional Hospital – Jake Thayer reported that BRH is hosting a cybersecurity tabletop exercise on Friday, and BRH is trying to plan a quarterly luncheon meet and greet with the LEPC, Coast Guard, and public.

Media – Justin Shoman reported that KTOO has started preparing for the upcoming flood season. KTOO plans to provide similar coverage of the river as last year, but make it more sustainable with funding and equipment that can dedicated to that cause. KTOO is specifically looking for \$20,000 in funding for more river cameras.

Red Cross – Loren Jones reported on two recent vehicle fires, and noted the need to be cautious around vehicles that have been stuck over the winter time. Additional financial assistance is available for Typhoon Haalong.

National Weather Service – Nicole Ferrin reported CBJ is moving toward springtime weather, and FWS is ramping up with outreach on GLOF issues. NWS is meeting with the Corps of Engineers and hopes to get high watermark signs out in July, two on Forest Service property and two on CBJ property, so tourists understand that it's not a safe place watch the flood from.

ADOT – Ken Murphy noted thit was a tough winter for maintenance crews, and ADOT is busy patching holes. He noted trash on the roadways and pallets being burned on turnouts. ADOT has responsibility for unhoused encampments. Teams have to be hazwoper certified. It's important to make sure that encampments don't get so big that it becomes a major endeavor.

Elected Official – Nano Brooks reported that Sealaska is the contractor for Phase 2 GLOF prep. CBJ is addressing Hesco barrier expansion, and still working on an enduring solution.
