A. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS- Chairman Ed Williams

F. STAFF REPORTS

Elected Official – Nano Brooks reported that the CBJ Assembly approved construction of the HESCO barriers for a 63,500 cfs flood event to fill the need for the upcoming years until an enduring solution has been developed.

Emergency Programs –Ryan O’Shaughnessy reported on the Emergency Operations Plan update and noted that focus groups will be happening next month. The plan includes functional and hazard annexes. Emergency Programs wrapped up the avalanche forecasting season with avalanche forecaster John Bressette; Ryan acknowledged John’s effort through a historic season. Ryan said the United Way led VOAD effort is getting organized and it’s great to see that program maturing. ICS 300 training opportunity is offered next week and there are still seats available. Suicide Basin monitoring is starting again and will be available on the CBJ website soon. The basin is longer than expected this year and the water is 60 feet higher than it was at this time last year. This is not a huge change and agencies will continue to monitor it.

JPD - Jeremy Weske reported on training projects. (zoom audio unclear)

CCFR – Chief Tom Hatley reported that the cruise ship season is increasing the number of calls. He noted recruiting and training efforts, and said that CCFR is developing an independent operational plan for the GLOF.

Bartlett Regional Hospital – Jake Thayer reported on the recent fire at the hospital, and noted that the cybersecurity tabletop training was cancelled for this reason. No injuries were reported. He mentioned the active construction season and that parking is tight. BRH will be testing MOAs on evacuation and shelter procedures in mid-June.

Red Cross – Brita Tonneson reported on the new CEO for the Alaska Region, coordination with VOAD, spring breakup issues across the state, and other projects. (zoom audio unclear)

Alaska Native Tribal - Alisha Sell reported that eight participants completed the last CERT training. She is creating a self-paced online CERT class combined with a half to full day of in-person training to complete the program; this will have final approval soon. The online program will be available to grant-serviced communities as well as Juneau. CCTHITA had the first Unified Command staff meeting to prepare for GLOF efforts.

US Coast Guard – Mike Pierson reported that a team will be coming up for work assessment here in Juneau (zoom audio unclear). USCG is rescheduling the drone workshop. It will still be in Ketchikan, but it will be the week of July 20.

G. AGENDA TOPICS. Crisis Track software presentation. Sarah McDonald, CBJ Emergency Programs. Sarah provided an overview of Crisis Track features. She noted that Crisis Track allows CBJ to track different events, search and rescue, track resources and costs, evacuations, and damage assessment, and more. She explained that CBJ can't go into houses. Crisis Track allows staff, volunteers, and residents to take photos of damage and upload it into the system. This makes it possible for CBJ to get reimbursement from FEMA more quickly, and offers real-time report tracking to quickly get information to leadership visually. Damage is visually marked in the maps as minor, major, or destroyed. Assessors Office information is integrated into the software to facilitate quick estimates on damage. This provides great back-up if/when CBJ receives Individual Assistance funds. VOAD volunteers are getting trained on the system. Ryan noted that it's an important tool for data support for Public Assistance grants. It's also very important for real-time tasks assignments; it contributes to a common operating picture to assign tasks to the groups based on the structures impacted, such as evacuation, damage assessment, culverts, etc.
