- 1. Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee (PRAC) - Appointments & Annual Report

Per Resolution 2646, the Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee shall consist of nine members appointed by the Assembly to serve in staggered three-year terms.

The Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee has three seats all with full terms beginning immediately (March 1, 2021) and ending February 28, 2024. One member has applied for reappointment.

- 2. Juneau Human Rights Commission (JHRC) Appointment

Per Resolution 2738 the Juneau Human Rights Commission is a five member commission appointed by the Assembly for staggered three-year terms. Members shall be selected to provide the most balanced representation possible.

There is one vacant seat on the commission for an unexpired term ending May 31, 2021. Since the vacancy is within 6 months of the term ending the person appointed to the seat can also be appointed to the full term beginning June 1, 2021 and ending May 31, 2024.

A. Board Matters

A. Jensen Olson Arboretum Advisory Board (JOAAB) - Annual Report & Appointments

Jensen Olson Arboretum Advisory Board Chair, Nell McConahey was in attendance and gave an overview of the boards annual report. She welcomed the new Arboretum Manager Ginger Hudson and thanked outgoing manager Merrill Jensen for all his hard work over the last 13 1/2 years as the first arboretum manager.

2020 was a challenging year for the arboretum; with COVID protocols in place all educational programming was cancelled for the year. Thankfully due to the layout of the arboretum and the ability to safely social distance it was the only Parks & Recreation

facility that was able to stay open throughout the pandemic. With the lack of cruise ships and independent travelers overall visits were down from the previous year; however visits from locals remained very high, many making multiple visits during the season - stating it was one of the few places that remained open.

MOTION: by Mr. Jones for the Assembly Human Resources Committee to recommend to the Assembly to reappoint Catherine Evans, Patricia Harris and Ed Buyarski to the Jensen Olson Arboretum Board all to terms beginning immediately and ending January 31, 2024 and to appoint Sarah Dolan to an unexpired term beginning immediately and ending January 31, 2022. ***Hearing no objection, motion passed.***

B. Juneau Commission on Aging - Appointments and Amending Resolution 2802

MOTION: by Mr. Smith for the Assembly Human Resources Committee to recommend to the Assembly to reappoint Jennifer Carson and Carole Ende to public seats and Janet Beauchamp to a 65+ seat, all for unexpired terms beginning immediately and ending December 31, 2022. ***Hearing no objection, motion passed.***

MOTION: by Ms. Woll to recommend an ordinance be drafted by the Law Department and forwarded to the full Assembly for action to remove the sunset date from the Juneau Commission on Aging Resolution 2802 and asked for unanimous consent. ***Hearing no objection, motion passed.***

C. Sister Cities Committee Appointments

MOTION: by Ms. Woll for the Assembly Human Resources Committee to recommend to the Assembly to reappoint Junnie Chup to an unexpired term on the Sister Cities Committee beginning immediately and ending January 1, 2022. ***Hearing no objection, motion passed.***

D. Douglas Advisory Board Appointment

MOTION: by Mr. Smith for the Assembly Human Resources Committee to recommend to the Assembly to appoint Ed Schoenfeld to an unexpired term on the Douglas Advisory Board beginning immediately and ending September 30, 2023. ***Hearing no objection, motion passed.***

E. Other Business

A. Adding Equity Commitment as part of HRC's Charge

The committee discussed how to make sure there is an equity commitment moving forward at the Assembly level now that the anti-racism resolution has been passed, the Systemic Racism Review Committee (SRRC) created and the Assembly members have all been through the 2-day diversity training put on by First Alaskan's Institute.

Mr. Jones asked, how do we get a diversity of people to apply and how to enforce it; continue with non-equity or don't appoint people and possibly run into quorum issues. First we need applicants, we need to get people to apply for boards and committees.

When the SRRC gets beyond looking at legislation perhaps they could look at how do we get people appointed.

Chair Bryson would like the HRC to be a 'home' for those types of discussion around equity and bringing it to the forefront. Ms. Woll agreed with adding equity discussions to the charge of the Human Resources Committee.

B. Discussion on Advisory Board Trainings Happening March 18 & 20

The Advisory Board Training will take place on Thursday, March 18 from 6-8pm and on Saturday, March 20 from 9-11am. If there is a specific topic an Assemblymember would like to present on they should let Chair Bryson know. Some topics to be covered: role as a liaison, role as an appointed board member, parliamentary procedure, Open Meetings Act and lastly - show up, be active and read the material.

VI. STAFF REPORTS

Ms. Cathcart asked the committee if they would like to move back to a 6:00pm start time. Committee members agreed to move back to a 6:00pm start time unless it is a full agenda then a 5:30pm start time would be appropriate.

VII. COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chair Bryson raised the discussion of what would be the criteria for dissolving an advisory board or committee; has the committee completed the duties it was charged with from the Assembly? Mr. Jones remarked this has been a reoccurring topic for the HRC over the years. Boards and committees tend to go in cycles, lots of participation/no vacancies or no participation/lots of vacancies depending on community interest and Assembly goals. Mr. Smith and Ms. Woll both suggested it would be worth looking at criteria around continued relevancy of a board or committee.

When advisory boards and committees present annual reports to the Human Resources Committee Chair Bryson recommended asking the question "Is your board still necessary and being utilized to its full extent?" This topic could help spark conversation around was is/isn't working for advisory boards and committees and if they have full-filled their original charge from the Assembly.

Subject: Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee 2020 Annual Report

The City & Borough of Juneau Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee (PRAC) meets the first Tuesday of each month at 5:30 P.M. The PRAC is comprised of nine members appointed by the Assembly for three-year terms. Like many other boards and commissions, PRAC was impacted by COVID-19 and only held eight public meetings in 2020. Six of these were remote virtual meetings.

While COVID-19 impacted our community and the Parks and Recreation Department (Department) at all levels, the passion and dedication of the Department staff was very apparent. While many had to perform their expected P&R roles and responsibilities, many were also assigned varying levels of additional commitment to deal with the pandemic. Despite taking on new responsibilities and being thrust into new situations not experienced before, the Department was able to safely provide the appropriate level of service and also find new ways to support the community and help reduce the associated stresses related to the pandemic. The Department, at all levels, deserves a huge amount of praise for their effort and willingness to go above and beyond to meet their mission.

In response to COVID-19, the Department has been very proactive in managing budgets and costs. These included reduced hours and elimination in staff. While parks, trails, and other outdoor facilities saw remarkable increases in demand since March 2020, the pandemic severely impacted the ability of the Department to deliver many programs and services to the public. As result of these management practices, the Department came in with a net savings of \$146,800 from the estimated FY21 budget.

Despite the challenges this year, the Department developed several new, low cost, and family oriented programs to safely get people to explore our parks, improve their mental and physical health, and promote economic opportunities. These included the Community Drive-Ins, Crack the Code, Auto Bingo, Pumpkin Carving, and Candy Cane Hunt, to name a few.

In 2020, PRAC said farewell to Jon Gellings and Kirsten Shelton. We thank them for their volunteer service and thoughtful input as they filled their term. PRAC welcomed Alex Beebe-Giudice and Ron Crenshaw as new members filling a three year term.

A new PRAC sub-committee, the Capital Improvements Program (CIP) sub-committee, was established in 2020 to effectively research and make recommendations to the larger PRAC. The CIP sub-committee worked with the Department, reviewed projects, costs and priorities, and made recommendations to the PRAC and Department to assist in the development of the Parks & Recreation Department Six-Year Capital Improvement Plan, including the Department's FY22 request.

While the PRAC received updates, took public comment, and provided input to the Department, several larger issues came before the PRAC this year. These included:

- Montana Creek Road: Motorized Restricted Winter Use Request
- Establishment of the Mill Campground (relocation of Thane campground)
- COVID-19 Impacts to Parks and Recreation Programs and Facilities
- COVID Conservation Corps (CCC) & Youth Employment in Parks (YEP) Expansion
- Amalga Meadows Public Use Cabin
- Infrastructure General Obligation Bond Package
- Juneau Trail Master Plan

Projects that warrant further discussion includes the Montana Creek Road, the CCC, and the Amalga Meadows Public Use Cabin. Several meetings were dedicated to the Nordic Ski Club's request to restrict motorized use of Montana Creek Road in the winter. These meetings included testimony from nearly 100 citizens from both sides, and over 500 written comments for PRAC to review and evaluate in making their recommendation to allow continued motorized use of Montana Creek Road during the winter months. We also had cause for several celebrations. The CCC program and their effort to deal with deferred maintenance issues and develop new facilities in our community was a huge success. We want to thank the CCC and all who made the program possible and hope this model is able to continue well into the future. And lastly, we would like to recognize our partnership with the Juneau Park Foundation who in partnership with the Department, the Rasmuson Foundation, volunteers, and others, were able to get a new public use recreation cabin built at Amalga Meadows. This wildly popular facility was sold out in minutes when the first three months of rental was made available to the public.

Additionally, the PRAC took public comment on a wide range of issues, providing support for several Parks & Recreation initiatives, and making recommendations to the Assembly. Planning and management highlights of 2020 include:

I wanted to take a minute to recognize our Assembly liaison Wade Bryson. He has attended all but one PRAC meeting this year. His continued passion and support is greatly appreciated.

There are several others that we owe gratitude and deserve acknowledgment. Firstly, Merrill Jensen retired as manager of the Jensen Olson Arboretum after 13 years. Merrill has worked tirelessly and achieved Nationally Accredited Plant Collection status for the genus *Primula* (primrose), and reaching Level II Accreditation of ArbNet. Both accreditations recognize his efforts in achieving professional standards for the arboretum. If you have not been to the arboretum in the last few years, please go this spring and summer and see the many improvements at the hand of Merrill and his staff. Secondly, Treadwell Arena Manager Lauren Anderson was presented with the Bob Robertson Service Award by the Alaska Recreation & Parks Association for her dedicated service to the Association. And finally, we want to recognize our relationship with the Juneau Park Foundation. In addition to the Amalga Meadows Public Recreation Cabin, the Foundation spearheaded the public campaign 'Yes on Prop 2', in support of the \$15 million dollar Infrastructure General Obligation Bond Proposition that was passed by the community at 62%. The Foundation has also made several financial contributions and volunteer efforts for several parks throughout Juneau. We look forward to our long-term partnership with this new non-profit dedicated to parks in our community and look for similar support from the Assembly for the Park Foundation.

Again, I want to acknowledge and bring to light the exceptional service at all levels within the P&R Department; from the Director, his staff, the many volunteers, and all who have contributed to continuing the mission of the Department. This dedication once again proves why Juneau is the amazing community that it is. It shows our perseverance and caring for our neighbors in a time of crisis; with us all coming together. During the pandemic, the value of our recreation facilities and programs, parks, trails, and open space was front and center a critical component in the physical and mental health well-being of our citizens. I hope you continue to support these programs and facilities with the adequate funding, despite the challenging financial decisions that need to be made in 2021.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

Resolution 2646

A Resolution Reestablishing the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee and Repealing Resolutions 711 and 1082.

WHEREAS, the Assembly, by Resolution 711, as amended by Resolution 1082, established a Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee (PRAC) of nine members in order to advise the City and Borough on matters affecting parks and recreation issues in the City and Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee adopted its own bylaws on May 12, 1999, in order to achieve its objectives and goals; and

WHEREAS, the CBJ Parks and Recreation Department and the PRAC wish to repeal the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee bylaws, as well as Resolutions 711 and 1082, in order to simplify them and incorporate them into a single resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

Section 1. Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee Reestablished. There is established the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, which shall consist of nine members appointed by the Assembly.

Section 2. Membership Qualifications. The Assembly shall appoint members to the Committee to staggered three-year terms. A new member shall be seated upon appointment by the Assembly and serve until their term ends or until their successor is appointed.

Section 3. Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee's Purpose. The purpose of the PRAC is to act in an advisory capacity for planning and development of all aspects of juvenile and adult recreation in the City and Borough. This direction includes authority to advise the Assembly and the Parks and Recreation Department Director on issues affecting parks and recreation in the community.

A secondary purpose of the Committee is to act as a citizens' proponent for parks and recreation facilities, recreation activities, and trails within the City and Borough.

The Committee shall gather relevant information from all sources available, hold public meetings as necessary on issues under review, and report to the Assembly concerning the status of the above-named issues.

Section 4. Procedure. The Committee's procedure shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order except where superseded by the Advisory Board Rules of Procedure and the Assembly's Rules of Procedure, as such may be amended from time to time.

Section 5. Officers, Meetings, Quorum. In accordance with the Advisory Board Rules of Procedure, the Committee shall select its own officers, and shall hold regular meetings on a schedule established by the Committee as well as such special meetings as required to conduct business.

Section 6. Special Committees. Special committees to facilitate any PRAC business may be created either at the sole discretion of the PRAC chairperson or by a majority vote of the members. The PRAC chairperson shall appoint one member to serve as chairperson of each special committee.

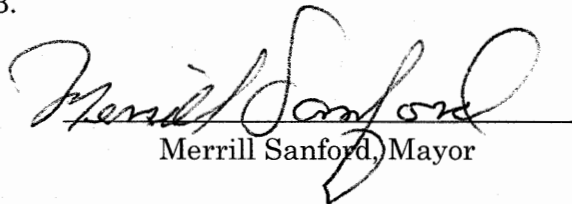
Section 7. Staff Assistance. Staff support and assistance to the PRAC may be provided by the City Manager as available and appropriate.

Section 8. Repeal of Resolutions. Resolution 711, adopted November 6, 1980, and Resolution 1082, adopted January 7, 1985, are hereby repealed.

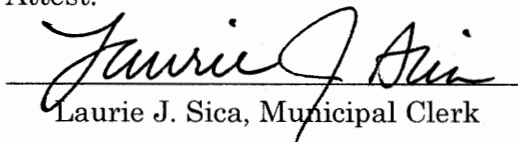
Section 9. Repeal of Bylaws. The Bylaws of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, adopted May 12, 1999, are hereby repealed.

Section 10. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

Serial No. 2738

A Resolution Reestablishing the Juneau Human Rights Commission for the Purpose of Amending the Number of Commission Members, and Repealing Resolution No. 2436.

WHEREAS, the Assembly of the City and Borough of Juneau established the Human Rights Commission in 1992, by Resolution No. 1615(am), to address the issue of discrimination and harassment within the City and Borough of Juneau; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly re-established the Commission by Resolution No. 2209 in 2003, and again in 2008 with Resolution No. 2436; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly's purpose in establishing the Human Rights Commission, as stated in Resolution Nos. 1615(am), 2209 and 2436 remains unchanged: the Assembly finds discrimination against an inhabitant of the municipality because of any characteristic unrelated to merit is a matter of public concern, threatening the peace, order, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, it continues to be the policy of the municipality to eliminate and prevent discrimination and harassment; and

WHEREAS, it is the Assembly's intent to re-establish the Commission without change, except that the Assembly Human Resources Commission passed a motion on December 21, 2015, approving a change in the Commission's membership from seven members to five.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

Section 1. Human Rights Commission re-established.

(a) There is established a human rights commission consisting of five persons, which shall be known as the City and Borough of Juneau Human Rights Commission.

(1) The Assembly shall appoint members of the Commission to staggered three-year terms. Members shall be selected to provide the most balanced representation possible. A member of the Commission shall be eligible for reappointment.

(b) The Commission is charged to:

- (1) Develop educational and informational programs designed to bring about the prevention and elimination of all forms of discrimination, including hate crimes;
- (2) Promote harmonious intergroup relations within the City and Borough of Juneau by making connections and enlisting the cooperation of racial, religious and nationality groups, business, community, labor and governmental organizations, fraternal and benevolent associations, education and other groups concerned with human rights.
- (3) Examine sources of tension, practices of discrimination, hate crimes, and acts of prejudice in the City and Borough of Juneau.
- (4) Advise the Assembly concerning solutions to specific problems of prejudice or discrimination, including hate crimes.
- (5) Recommend to the Assembly, action, policies, and legislation to be considered by state and local governments.

Section 2. Procedure. The Commission's procedure shall be governed by the Advisory Board Rules of Procedure, as such may be amended from time to time.

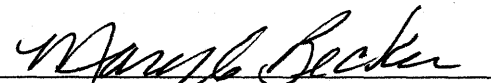
Section 3. Officers, Meetings, Quorum. In accordance with the Advisory Board Rules of Procedure, the Commission shall select its own officers, and shall hold regular meetings on a schedule established by the Commission, as well as such special meetings as required to conduct business. The presence of three members constitutes a quorum and any action of the Commission requires three or more affirmative votes to be approved.

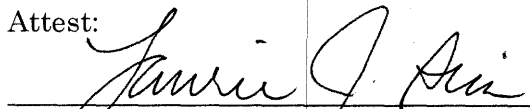
Section 4. Staff Assistance. Staff support to the Commission shall be provided by the City Manager as available and appropriate.

Section 5. Repeal of Resolution. Resolution No. 2436, adopted on February 11, 2008, is repealed.

Section 6. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately after its adoption.

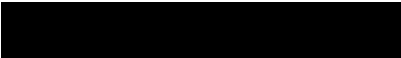
