Phase 2 Effective May 8, 2020



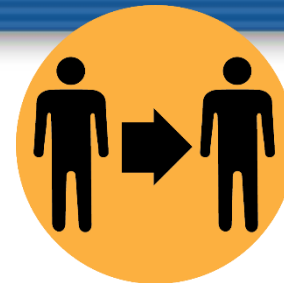
- On April 22, Governor Dunleavy announced Health Mandate 016 which outlines Phase 1 of his *Reopen Alaska Responsibly Plan*.
- Phase 2 seeks to balance the ongoing need to slow the rate of infection with the critical need to resume economic activity in a reasonable and safe manner.
- Phase 2 attachments provide guidance for various sectors of Alaska's economy.

Lifting restrictions depends on:



- Disease burden that is initially decreasing for 14 days and no exponential growth moving forward;
- A surveillance system capable of promptly detecting any increase in infection;
- A public health system that is actively tracking all cases of COVID-19; and
- A health care system that has the capacity to handle all cases and that can rapidly deal with a surge in cases.

Metrics



We will be following these metrics to move forward:

- ☐ **Epidemiology:** Disease burden and trends
- ☐ **Testing:** Overall volume, fast turnaround of results and reporting
- ☐ **Public Health Capacity:** Monitoring and contact investigations
- ☐ **Health care capacity:** Ensuring hospitals have adequate capacity and supplies (PPE, hospital beds) to care for COVID-19 patients and other patients needing urgent care.

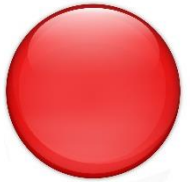
When we can lift advisories and mandates



GO: If we're seeing downward trends and all is going well, we'll methodically move to **lift restrictions**.



PROCEED WITH CAUTION: If the situation is stable or we are seeing a slow increase in cases, we may ask for **voluntary measures to flatten the curve**.



STOP: If we are seeing a consistent or rapid increase in cases or if we think we are running out of capacity to care for people with COVID-19 (regardless of the trend in cases), then we will need to **re-implement some restrictions**.

Different areas may follow different rules

- We can use geography to our advantage to prevent cases from spreading. Local authorities can work with the State if more strict or more liberal rules are needed, depending on their unique situation.
- Working with the state, different communities may implement different phases at different times. This will allow for more precise control of COVID-19.

Phase 2 – Key Components

- ☐ Most non-essential businesses reopen, with safeguards
- ☐ 50% capacity for businesses open in Phase 1
- ☐ 25% capacity for bars, fitness centers, theaters, libraries, and entertainment venues
- ☐ Social and religious gatherings of fewer than 50

General Guidelines

- Continue social distancing at least six feet away from non-household members.
- Cloth face coverings are strongly encouraged.
- Wash your hands frequently and regularly sanitize frequently-touched surfaces.
- Telephone and online ordering for contactless pickup and delivery encouraged.
- Pre-shift screening. Symptomatic or ill employees not allowed to work.



Retail, Restaurants, & Non-Essential

- 50% capacity for businesses such as retail, restaurants, and other non-essential businesses.
- Walk-ins permitted.



Personal Care Services

- 50% capacity or up to 20 patrons
- Reservations only.



Social and Religious Gatherings

- Capacity increased to gatherings of 50 people gatherings



Fitness Centers

- 25% capacity with walk-ins permitted;
- 10-foot distance between patrons indoors;
- Outdoor activities up to 50 people;

Swimming Pools

- 50% pool capacity
- Walk-ins permitted



Bars, Libraries, & Museums

- 25% capacity with walk-ins permitted;
- Distance of 6-feet between patrons;
- Cloth face coverings for staff;



- Expanding intrastate travel;
- Increased capacity in childcare facilities;
- Re-opening of organized sports and overnight camps.

Situational Update – Incident Level 2 - Operational Period 12 (5/07/2020 – 5/14/2020).

Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

The case count has remained stable over the last 14 days.

Testing:

Testing capacity and supplies remain good. Logistics continues to try and increase testing supplies particularly for the test kits that can be processed locally.

Hospital Response:

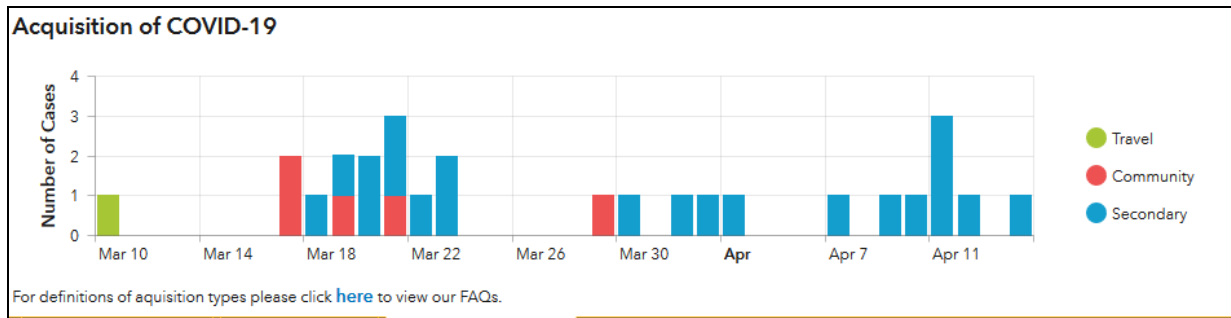
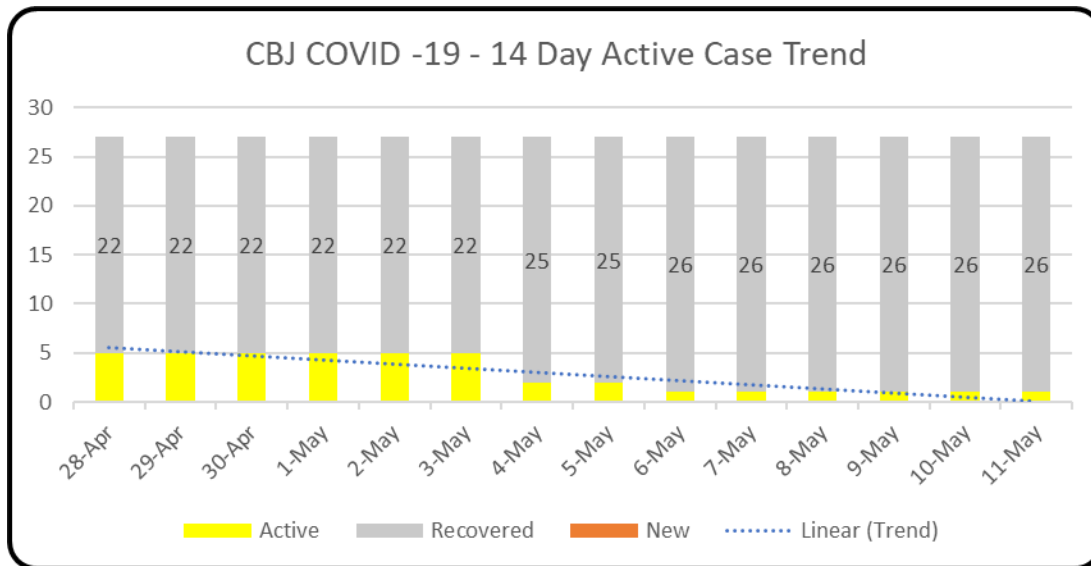
BRH reports adequate supply of PPE and no concerns related to workforce availability.

Issues of Note:

EOC continues to work on the testing plan and associated logistics for the unsheltered population.

Operational Highlights

Airport Screening: 148 Saturday, 68 on Sunday. 9 flights in beginning June 1, Delta beginning June 8. .

Mobile Screening:

11 calls came into the hotline, 4 referred for testing, 4 appointments scheduled.

There were 11 tests at drive through, 7 of which were for medical related appointments, 1 was completed at home. To date, sampled 424 for testing. 1 welfare check was completed via phone.

Mt. Jumbo: No clients

BRH: Hospital Week activities. 4 surgeries scheduled for today, all tests came back in the designated time frame.

Monday – Juneau School District Focus

Meals

Total meals served since March 16th: 25,332 breakfast + 25,332 lunch = 50,664.

50 days worth of meals as we added weekend meals 4 weeks ago.

Average meals per day = 1013 (breakfast + lunch).

Average students served per day - 507

The last day for meal service is May 22.

Graduation

Plans are coming together for recognizing and celebrating the Class of 2020 in Juneau. A Grad Task Team of representatives from JDHS, TMHS and YDHS finalized the schedule on Friday. Each school is working out the details and communicating the plan to students and families.

The main activities are:

Seniors will go to their school at an appointed time to allow for minimal contact and preserve social distancing. They will walk across the graduation stage set up for each individual school in their caps and gowns to receive their diploma cover and have a professional graduation photo taken. Each graduate will receive a gift bag with many items including a program listing classmates, school momentos, and gifts from the school and community (including the Parents for a Safe Graduation Committee). By the end of May a graduation video with each student's professional cap and gown photo and name, along with traditional graduation speeches, music and video of the school will be provided online for each school's ceremony.

Details of the process for TMHS are posted on the school's website. All three schools will be substantially similar.

The high schools are working on a Scholarship and Senior award recognition program to share with graduates so those achievements can be celebrated as well. Senior awards will be presented to students via video from school department heads this year.

Graduation banners are going up around town. There are two very large Senior 2020 banners near JDHS/YDHS and TMHS that contain photos of every senior produced by the Parents for a Safe Graduation Committee. Capital Transit will be displaying these posters on buses as well. Senior families are displaying yard signs in front of homes to recognize grads.

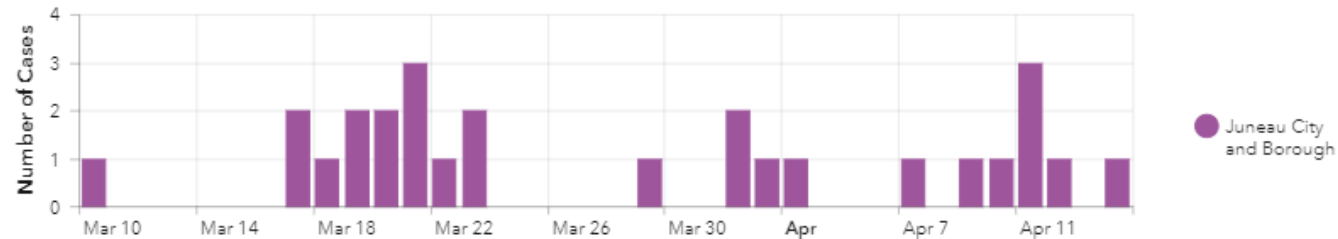

Juneau Epi Curve by source of acquisition: most cases have been secondary spread, as in they were a contact to a known case. These individuals are typically already in communication with local Public Health Nurses for daily monitoring, and are home-isolating. Limited community-level spread (5 total).

Laboratory Confirmed Cases of COVID-19



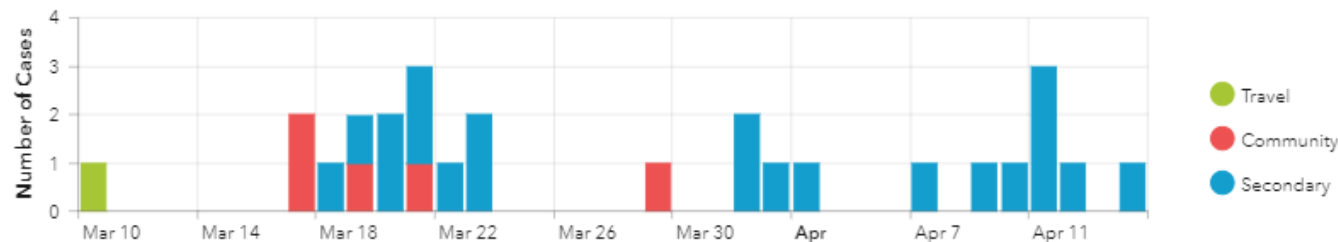
Cases appear by report or onset date - whichever is earliest; therefore case counts may change as new data becomes available.

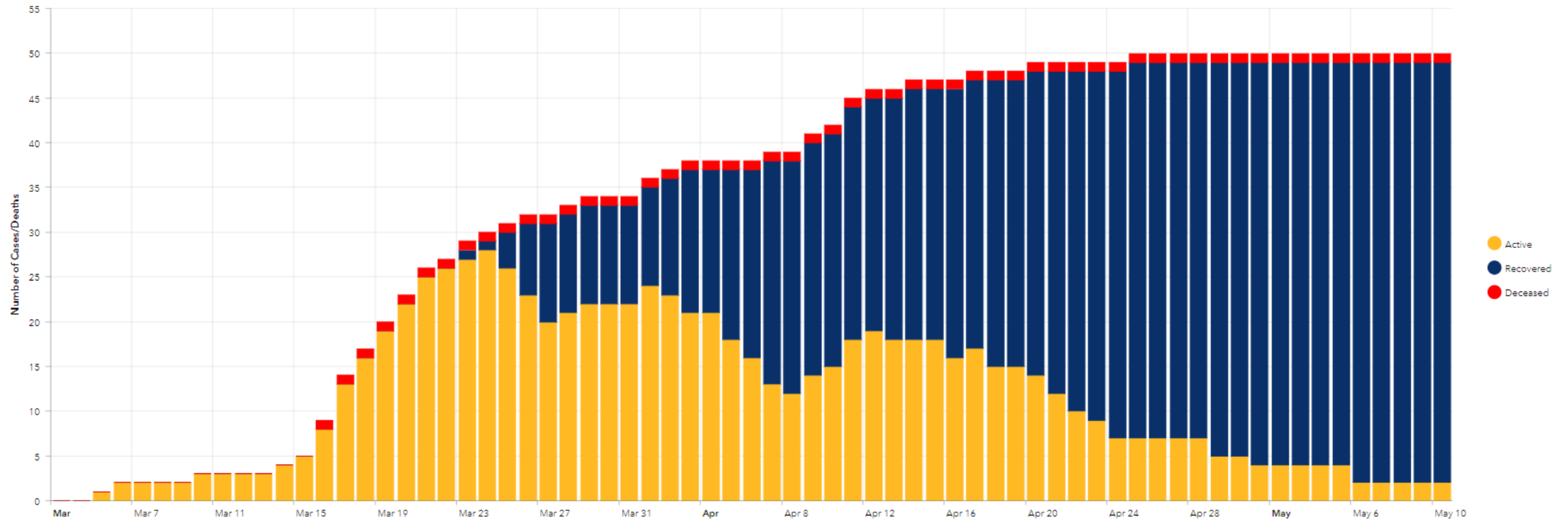


AK COVID-19 Cumulative Cases by Death, Recovered, and Active Status

All data are updated daily at noon and are current through the previous day

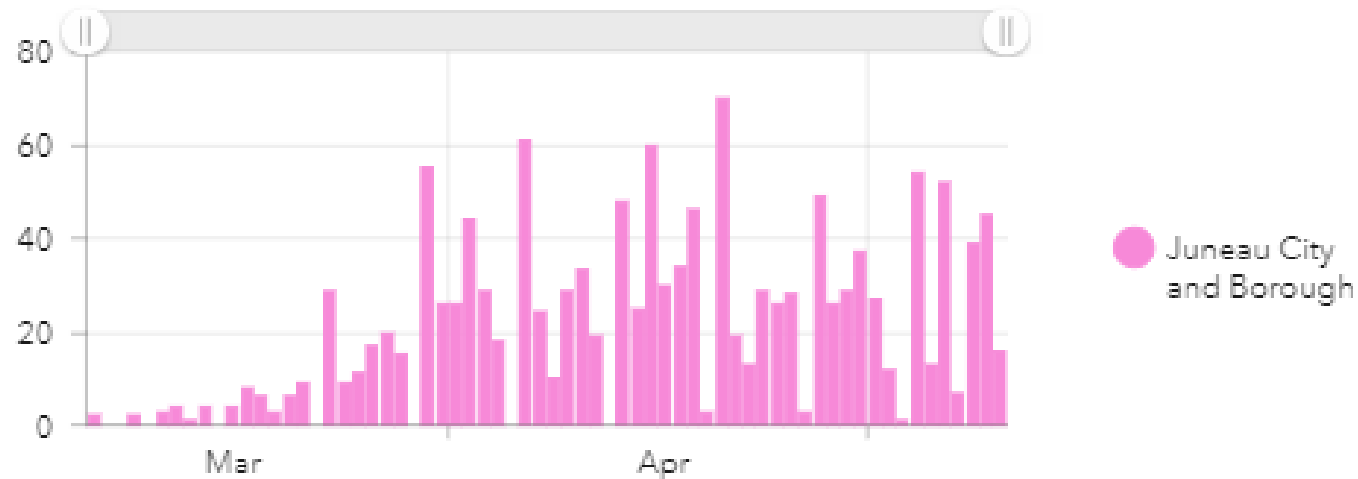

Daily Tests by Borough (Combined)



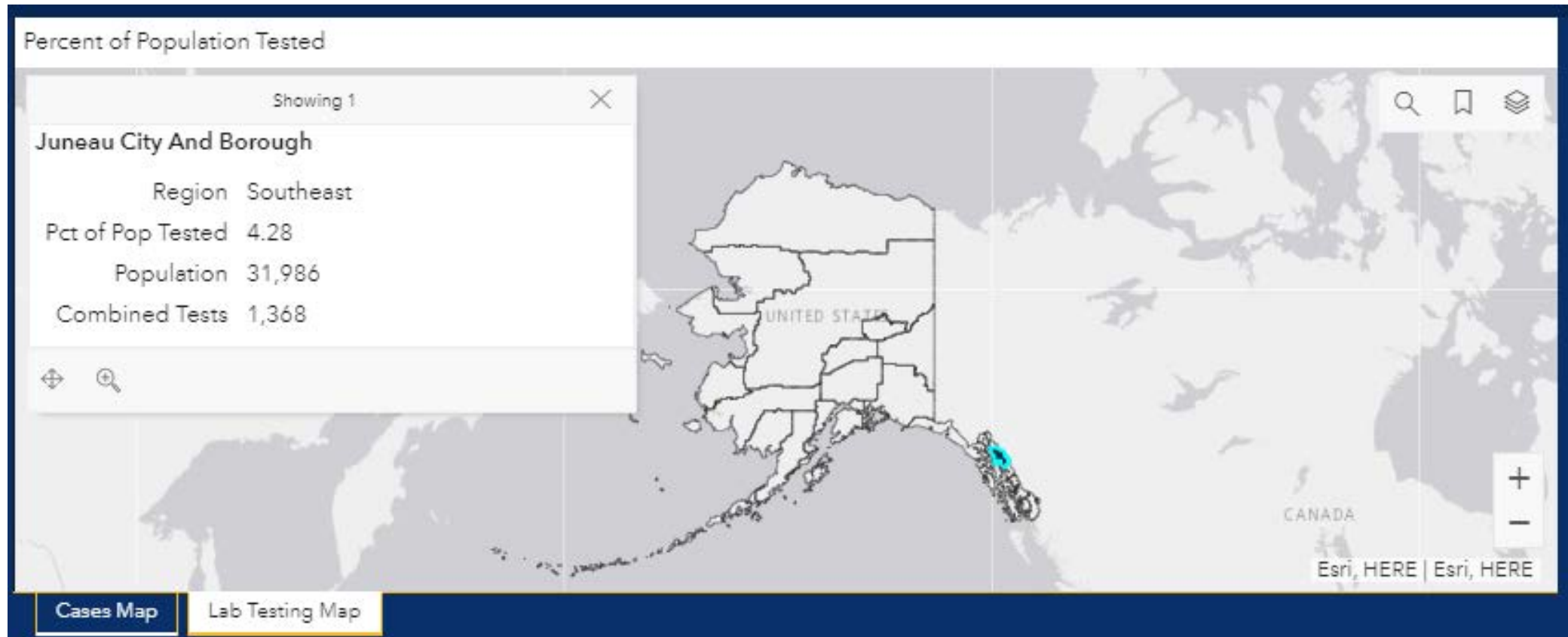
